**Regular Meeting of the Township Council**  
**Monday, March 13, 2006**  
**8:00 PM**

**CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER**

Council President Menville called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM in the Council Chambers of Town Hall located at 406 Rivervale Road, River Vale, NJ 07675.

**SALUTE TO FLAG**

Council President Menville asked all in attendance to rise and join him in a Salute to the Flag.

**SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT**

Council President Menville read the “Sunshine Statement” into the record, as follows:

*“In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Open Public Meetings Law, notification of this meeting has been sent to all officially appointed Township newspapers and notice is posted at the Municipal Office.”*

**ROLL CALL**

Councilman de Stefan, Councilman Jasionowski, Councilman Matos and Council President Menville were present. Councilman Blundo was absent.

Also present: Wanda A. Worner, Township Clerk and Karen Padva, Deputy Township Clerk. John M. Carbone, Township Attorney was absent.

**TOWNSHIP COMMUNICATION**

Councilman de Stefan stated that he would like to thank the Centennial Committee and all other volunteers for their hard work this weekend on the craft fair. He stated that the fair was a great success and would like to present all who volunteered their time with a certificate. Mayor Paschalis agreed that it was a great success and stated that if Councilman de Stefan gave him the names of all involved that Town Hall would issue certificates.

Councilman Matos stated that the Zoning/Planning Committee has met and reviewed the property maintenance and demolition ordinance and will make recommendations to the administration for changes.

Councilmen Jasionowski and Menville had no comments this evening.

**#2006-80**  
**Establishing River Vale All Star Basketball Inc., as a Quasi-Public Entity**

WHEREAS, the Township of River Vale is a participating member of the Bergen County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund (hereinafter referred to as the "Fund") relative to general liability and other coverage; and

WHEREAS, the Fund has adopted certain criteria to distinguish between bona fide municipal

activities and other quasi-public entities not sponsored by the municipality and, therefore, not subject to coverage by the Fund; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that in order to be covered by the Fund, an organization or activity must meet the test that its function is of the type that historically municipalities have undertaken themselves or have provided with insurance coverage and/or is one which advances a bona fide local public purpose on a non-profit basis typically met by a local government, the benefits of which are available to the municipality in general; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that

a) the Township of River Vale certifies that **River Vale All-Star Basketball, Inc.** is classified as a Class IV organization for Joint Insurance Fund purposes.

b) The Township of River Vale does hereby request that the organization described herein be named as additionally named insured for general liability and non-owned automobile coverage's in accordance with the applicable limits and restrictions.

c) A certified copy of this Resolution, together with the "General Application" shall be filed with the Secretary of the Bergen County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund.

### **ORDINANCES – 1<sup>st</sup> reading**

Motion by Councilman Jasionowski; seconded by Councilman de Stefan to Introduce Ordinance #148-2006, as follows:

#### **ORDINANCE #148-2006**

#### **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE XXVI OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVER VALE ENTITLED “SHADE TREES”**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of River Vale that Article XXVI of the Code of the Township of River Vale be amended as follows:

Section 1. That Article XXVI, be amended to read “Shade Tree Advisory Committee”.

Section 2. That Section 142-134, Establishment; membership; terms; appointments; be amended as follows:

- a. “There is hereby established the Advisory Shade Tree Committee of the Township of River Vale. The Committee shall consist of seven members, three of whom shall be the Property Maintenance Officer and the Superintendent of Public Works and the Land Use Administrator.
- b. That the rest of Section 142-134 remains the same.

Section 3. That in Section 142-139, Advisory Shade Tree Committee is hereby deleted and replaced with the Property Maintenance Officer.

Section 4. That Section 142-142. Violations and penalties be amended, as follows:

“Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part 5 shall be liable to a find for the violation of each rule or regulation in the amount not exceeding \$300 for each violation and/or a replacement of tree illegally removed. Summons for violation of this Part 5 are to be issued by the Property Maintenance Officer.

Section 5. That all other parts of this section of the code remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall go in effect upon publication and advertisement in accordance with the law.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilman Jasionowski, Councilman de Stefan, Councilman Matos and Council President Menville voted yes. Councilman Blundo was absent.

Motion by Councilman de Stefan; seconded by Councilman Jasionowski to Introduce Ordinance #149-2006, as follows:

#### **ORDINANCE #149-2006**

#### **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #105-2005 ENTITLED “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE SIGN ORDINANCE**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of River Vale that Ordinance #105-2005 be amended as follows:

Section I. That Section 3. Window Signs (a) be amended to read as follows:

1. (a) Information on such signs shall be limited to advertisements for special promotions, temporary sales and other such similar nonpermanent sales promotions related to the relevant business. An exception shall be granted for restaurants, which may post one (1) menu not larger than two (2) square feet.

2. Section (b) be deleted in its entirety.

3. Section (c) be changed to (b)

4. Section (d) be changed to (c)

5. Section (e) be changed to (d) and that the maximum total area of such signs shall not exceed 25% and that 75% of the window area shall be open without merchandise displayed....

6. Section (f) be changed to (e) and the following wording added “no such sign shall be added, torn or improperly kept”.

ON THE QUESTION: Councilman deStefan questioned whether this ordinance would also cover pizzerias. He would like in house eating establishments included in the description of “restaurants”.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilman deStefan, Councilman Jasionowski, Councilman Matos and Council President Menville voted yes. Councilman Blundo was absent.

## **ORDINANCES – 2<sup>nd</sup> reading**

Motion by Councilman Jasionowski; seconded by Councilman Matos to Open the Public Hearing on Ordinance #144-2006, as follows:

### **#144-2006**

## **AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE INTENSITY OF THE USE IN AREAS OF STEEPLY SLOPING TERRAIN**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Council of the Township of River Vale, that the code be amended as follows:

### **Section 1. PURPOSE.**

The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the intensity of use in areas of steeply sloping terrain in order to limit soil loss, erosion, excessive storm water runoff, the degradation of surface water and to maintain the natural topography and drainage patterns of land.

### **Section 2. APPLICABILITY.**

This ordinance shall be applicable to any, subdivision, site plan, or land disturbance application located in the Township as defined in the Township Land Use Law or any project defined by the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act. Land Disturbance for the purpose of this ordinance shall mean any activity involving the clearing, cutting, excavation, grading, filling, storing, transporting, or the covering by artificial or natural materials, of land or any other activity which causes land to be exposed to the danger of erosion.

### **Section 3. SLOPE CLASS REQUIREMENTS.**

(A) On slopes of 25% or greater, no land disturbance, re-grading or stripping of vegetation shall be permitted. Land disturbance for roadway crossings, utility, or storm or sanitary sewer construction in areas of 25% slopes or greater are considered variance conditions and the applicant must affirmatively demonstrate that the roadway or utility improvements are necessary in the sloped area and that alternate means are not The sloped area to be developed, re-graded or stripped of vegetation shall be drawn on the development plans for each individual lot.

(B) The maximum disturbance allowed in slope areas between 20.0% to 24.9% shall be 15%.

(C) The maximum disturbance allowed in slope areas between 15.0% and 19.9% shall be 30%.

(D) The maximum disturbance allowed in slope areas between 0 to 14.9% may be 100%.

(E) Site design and grading on slopes greater than 15% shall provide the minimum disruption of view corridors and scenic vistas and shall preserve significant natural topographic features to the greatest extent possible.

(F) Steep Slope disturbance of an area less than four hundred (400) square feet shall be permitted on any parcel.

#### **Section 4. SITE PLAN SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS.**

All earth moving or disturbance activities on existing, pre-development slopes of ten (10%) percent or greater, shall be accompanied by a site plan prepared by a Licensed Professional Engineer and shall be submitted with all site plan and subdivision applications, and all other land development applications. For land disturbances not part of land development applications, a site plan shall be submitted to the Construction Official, who shall refer it to Township Engineer for review and determination of completeness. The Township Engineer shall recommend within 45 days receipt of a complete application either acceptance, rejection, and/or provide recommendations for compliance with the slope ordinances. Site Plans will include at a minimum the following:

(A) Slopes in classes of 0-14.9%, 15-24.9%, and greater than 25% based on two foot (2') contours analyzed on ten foot (10') vertical intervals.

(B) Location of all existing natural and topographic features, water bodies including but not limited to streams, lakes, and wetlands and their respective transition areas as affirmed by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

(C) Location of all proposed and existing buildings, impervious surfaces and streets.

(D) Location of all existing vegetation including meadow, forest and scrub lands broken down by those areas of vegetation which will be removed as well as vegetation to be preserved; specifications for re-vegetation shall also be included.

(E) Soil erosion and sedimentation controls shall be in accordance with the current edition of the "Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control in New Jersey" by the NJ Soil Conservation Committee.

(F) A statement and description of the stability of the soils on site and the appropriateness of the construction method proposed.

(G) Hydrology, drainage and flooding analysis to include a statement on the effect of the proposed development upon water bodies or wetlands in the vicinity of the project.

(H) A statement describing the underlying geology attesting to the stability of the site.

(I) Calculations of the area of proposed disturbance of each slope class on each proposed lot as well as within any proposed road right-of-way.

(J) Grading plan for the construction site and all access routes. The Township Engineer shall render a report to the Construction Official to accept or reject the plan as submitted and/or require specific conditions be complied with in order for the plan to meet approval. No construction or soil movement permits shall be issued and no grading or site clearing shall occur until a site plan including all of the above items has been reviewed and approved by the Township Engineer.

#### **Section 5. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS.**

All development proposals which propose development on steep slopes shall conform to the following performance standards:

(A) Lands to be preserved in one-hundred (100%) percent open space due to the presence of steep slopes may be offered for dedication to the Township, a private land trust, or a non-profit agency in order to preserve and maintain the area in its natural state or,

(B) Shall be preserved in perpetuity through the preparation of deed restrictions filed with the County Recording Officer in the form and description approved by the Township Engineer.

#### **Section 6. EXEMPTIONS.**

Land development plans which were granted and perfected final approval prior to the adoption date of this ordinance shall be exempt from these requirements.

#### **Section 7. COMPATIBILITY WITH OTHER PERMIT AND ORDINANCE REQUIREMENTS.**

Development approvals issued pursuant to this ordinance are to be considered an integral part of development approvals under the subdivision and site plan review process and do not relieve the applicant of the responsibility to secure required permits or approvals for activities regulated by other applicable codes, rules, acts or ordinances. In their interpretation and application, the provisions of this ordinance shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the promotion of the public health, safety, general welfare and the protection of water quality.

There being no questions or comments from the public on Ordinance #144-2006; motion by Councilman Jasionowski; seconded by Councilman Matos to close the Public Hearing on Ordinance #144-2006.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #134-2005 ENTITLED #130-2005 ENTITLED “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE #0-10-04 OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVER VALE, COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY ENTITLED FIXING AND DETERMINING MUNICIPAL CLASS POSITION TITLES AND SALARY RANGES FOR CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVER VALE”**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of River Vale, that Ordinance #0-10-04 of the Township of River Vale, is hereby amended as follows, until a subsequent salary ordinance is adopted:

**Section 1.** The salary ranges per annum of the following officer and employees of the Township of River Vale in the Unclassified Service (elected and appointed official) shall be as follows:

Police Dispatcher	\$25,000 - \$45,000
Business Administrator	\$83,000 - \$96,000
Superintendent DPW	\$65,000 - \$80,000
Construction Code Official	\$45,000 - \$55,000
Zoning Official	\$15,000 - \$25,000
Chief Financial Officer	\$15,000 - \$25,000
Electrical Sub Code Official	\$ 5,000 - \$10,000
Tax Collector	\$45,000 - \$55,000
<i>Assistant Building Inspector</i>	<i>\$1.00</i>
<i>Athletics Director</i>	<i>\$1.00 - \$10,000</i>

**Section 2.** The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to determine the salary of each employee within each salary range annually, such determination and salary to be effective the first day of each calendar year beginning 2004.

**Section 3.** All employees shall be paid on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of every month as stipulated in the Township Personnel Manual except for changes required on account of calendar year requirements.

**Section 4.** All parts or ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistent parts, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize any salary decrease. This ordinance shall take effect after passage in the manner provided by law, except that any and all such salary increases shall in all respects be subject to any provisions of law.

**Section 5.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

**Section 6.** Any ordinance or part of ordinance inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.
