Council Meeting
Monday, May 12, 2008

CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

Council President Jasionowski called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building located at 406 Rivervale Road, River Vale, New Jersey 07675.

SALUTE TO FLAG

Council President Jasionowski asked all in attendance to rise and join him in a Salute to the Flag.

SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT

Council President Jasionowski read the Sunshine Statement into the record, as follows:

“In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Open Public Meetings Law, notification of this meeting has been sent to all officially appointed Township newspapers and notice is posted at the Municipal Office.”

ROLL CALL

Councilman de Stefan, Councilman Bromberg, Councilwoman Sieg, and Council President Jasionowski were present. Councilman Matos was absent.

Also present: Mayor Joseph Blundo, Robert J. Gallione, Jr., Business Administrator, Holly Schepisi, Township Attorney, Dennis Harrington, Township Engineer, and Karen Padva, Acting Township Clerk.

CERTIFICATE OF RECOGNITION—Officer Christopher Bulger

M.A.D.D. New Jersey Law Enforcement Recognition Award

Mayor Blundo commended Police Officer Christopher Bulger on his accomplishment of having the most DUI arrests in Bergen County for the year 2007.

TOWNSHIP COMMUNICATION

1. Mayor’s Comments

Mayor Blundo gave an update on the defeated high school budget and that a compromise was reached. He commented that it is not in the best interest of any of the four (4) towns to unwind the district. The Mayor reported on the funds approved by the County to help preserve the Poplar Road properties. He added that Green Acres will not release the funds until COAH approves the purchase. The Mayor reported that the town is making progress towards its COAH 3rd Round Certification.

The Mayor announced that the Memorial Day Parade is scheduled for Saturday, May 24th at 10:00am starting at Roberge School. Peter Wayne will be the Grand Marshall of the parade. The Mayor concluded his report with comments about the recent evacuation of Holdrum School and that he would be meeting with the Chief to develop a better plan in the event the weather is inclement.

Mayor Blundo read a Proclamation for SEAT Belt Awareness into the record.

“Click It or Ticket”
May 19 through June 1, 2008

WHEREAS, there were 716 motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey in 2007; and

WHEREAS, a large percentage of the motor vehicle occupants killed in traffic crashes were not wearing a seat belt; and

WHEREAS, use of a seat belt remains the most effective way to avoid death or serious injury in a motor vehicle crash; and

WHEREAS, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimates that 135,000 lives were saved by safety belt usage nationally between 1975-2000; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide *Click It or Ticket* seat belt mobilization from May 19 – June 1, 2008 in an effort to raise awareness and increase seat belt usage through a combination of enforcement and education; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Highway Traffic Safety has set a goal of increasing the seat belt usage rate in the state from the current level of 91% to 93%; and

WHEREAS, a further increase in seat belt usage in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that I, Joseph Blundo, Mayor of the Township of River Vale along with all the Council members declare our support to the *Click It or Ticket* seat belt mobilization both locally and nationally from May 19 – June 1, 2008 and pledge to increase awareness of the mobilization and the benefits of seat belt use.

2. Council Comments

Councilman de Stefan added congratulations to P.O. Bulger on his accomplishment. Councilman de Stefan also remarked about an article in today's *The Record* and stressed the importance of maintaining the integrity of the school system. In conclusion, Councilman de Stefan commended the Mayor and Council President on the high school budget resolution.

Councilman Bromberg commended the Mayor and Council President and strongly supports the resolution amending the defeated High School budget. Councilman Bromberg also added his congratulations to Police Officer Bulger.

Councilwoman Sieg added her congratulations to Officer Bulger.

Council President Jasionowski commended all the staff, EMS and local schools on the recent evacuation of Holdrum School. Council President Jasionowski added his support of the Mayor to maintain our Regional High School system. He concluded his comments by stating that the residents of River Vale supported the defeated budget.

Mayor Blundo thanked Bergen Swan for their \$800,000 contribution toward the preservation of the Poplar Road parcel. They were very instrumental during this process.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

The Business Administrator gave updates of the Open Space ballot questions for the November General election; the clean-up effort at Sapienza Garden, the enrollment for Camp Have Some Fun is doing well and the Township will be conducting a dog census this summer.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Harrington gave updates on the DPW Building, final site work being done at the Lower Grove Baseball field, and the *Safe Routes to School* application has been submitted to the state. The Engineer gave an update on the Mark Lane Complex. Due to an underlying layer of peat there is more work and remediation involved. This cost was not included in the original estimate. The Engineer recommends removing the material, compact it and then replacing and compacting again. Mr. Harrington concluded his report with an update on the slope repair at Town Hall.

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

Motion by Councilman Bromberg; seconded by Councilwoman Sieg to open the meeting to the public.

Council President Jasionowski read the following statement into the record.

“Each person wishing to address the Council shall step up to the microphone, shall give his or her name in an audible tone for the record. All member of the public are expected to conduct themselves in a proper manner. Any derogatory, abusive or threatening statements will not be permitted. The Chair will immediately rule such conduct out of order and terminate any further comments.”

Maura Ellis – 84 Le Clerc Avenue – thanked the Mayor and Council for their work on the defeated High School budget. Mrs. Ellis invited the Mayor and Council to attend a Memorial Service on May 20th at 7:00pm for Dr. Sapienza.

Joe Massin – 68 Holiday Court – commented on the zoning ordinance on the agenda.

Ron Tucci – 58 Holiday Court – commented on an error made during revaluation of certain units at Holiday Farm. Mr. Tucci had additional questions regarding the award of Janitorial Services contract.

Mr. Howard Lawrence - 607 Montview Place – questioned the status of the settlement with one of his neighbors.

There being no further questions or comments from the public; motion by Councilman Bromberg; seconded by Councilman de Stefan to close the meeting to the public.

RESOLUTION APPROVING REVISED TAX LAVY FOR DEFEATED PASCACK VALLEY REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL BUDGET

WHEREAS, the voters of the Pascack Regional High School District defeated the 2008-09 School District Budget stated at the annual school election on April 15, 2008; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to State Law, the municipal governing body, after consultation with the Board of Education, is to determine and certify the amount or amounts to be raised by local taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Township of River Vale formed a subcommittee to meet with the subcommittees of the other three sending municipalities as well as the Board of Education Subcommittee; and

WHEREAS, said joint subcommittee met on April 23, 2008; and

WHEREAS, based upon the outcome of the April 23, 2008 meeting the Mayor and Township Council have determined the following:

GENERAL FUND:

- a. Original Tax Levy on Ballot – Base Budget General Fund: \$ 36,810,541.00
- b. Reduction: \$ 368,105.00

<u>Description</u>	<u>Line Item</u>	<u>Reduction</u>
Capital Project	12-000-400-450	\$ 368,105.00

- c. Revised Tax Levy Certified for Base Budget \$36,442,000.00

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of River Vale have determined that this reduction will continue to allow the Board of Education to provide quality services, utilize the expertise and experience of the existing staff, facilitate already identified reorganization of staffing as proposed by the Board of Education without detriment to the system; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of River Vale based upon the information provided by the Board the revised budget is sufficient to provide a thorough and efficient education; and

WHEREAS, the Township of River Vale’s original local tax levy portion as provided for in the April 15, 2008, election was: \$9,354,612.98; and

WHEREAS, the Township of River Vale’s ratio for the 2008 -2009 school year is 25.4128647; and

WHEREAS, the revised local tax levy as reflected in the above reduction is \$9,260,956.15

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of River Vale that said tax levy be and is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be sent to the Pascack Valley Regional High School District Board of Education, the Bergen County Superintendent of Schools, the Borough Hillsdale, Borough of Montvale and the Borough of Woodcliff Lake.

Article L “Division into Districts,” Chapter 142-221 “Zoning Districts and Map”

Paragraph B:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVER VALE, COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 33 OF THE NEW CODE ENTITLED “POLICE DEPARTMENT”

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of River Vale that Chapter 33 “Police Department”, Section 8 “Promotions” of the Code of the Township of River Vale is hereby amended in its entirety, as follows:

Section 8. Promotions.

A. The Township of River Vale desires to promote the most qualified candidates to positions of higher rank. This chapter establishes the eligibility requirements and the process for promotion to all higher ranks. The promotion process shall be on the basis of merit, experience, education, demonstrated ability, competitive examinations (for rank of lieutenant and below) as well as competitive written submissions (for rank of Captain and above). In accordance with N.J.S.A 40A:14-129, promotion of any officer shall be made from the membership of the Department. No person shall be eligible for promotion unless he or she shall have served as a full-time police officer in the Township of River Vale Police Department for a period of three years (N.J.S.A. 40A:14-130). No person shall be eligible for promotion to be a superior officer unless he or she has previously served as patrolman in such department or force (N.J.S.A. 40A:14-129).

B. Upon receiving instructions from the Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law to do so, the Chief of Police shall announce the promotional process to members of the Department

at least 60 calendar days before the written examination is to be given. The announcement shall be posted in common areas of the Department accessible to all members. The announcement shall contain at a minimum, the rank to be filled, the dates of the exams, source materials or reading lists from which exam questions will be taken or topics from which questions will be formulated. Candidates, who qualify, shall notify the Chief of Police of his or her interest in taking the examination by submitting a letter of interest no later than 14 calendar days after the promotion announcement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event an Officer is on vacation or sick leave during the initial 14 calendar day notification period and, as a result, is unable to submit a letter of interest, such Officer shall be entitled to provide his or her letter of interest to the Chief of Police within three days of his or her scheduled date of returning to work, provided such notice must be provided in all instances no later than 15 calendar days before the written examination is to be given. Such letter of interest shall include a statement that such candidate has read Chapter 33 "Police Department", Section 8 "Promotions" of the Code of the Township of River Vale, that such candidate wishes to participate in the promotional process for the available position and that such candidate agrees to abide by the promotional process set forth in Chapter 33 "Police Department", Section 8 "Promotions" of the Code with respect to the promotion process. In the event a candidate decides to not continue with the process the candidate shall promptly notify the Chief of Police in writing of his or her decision to not continue.

C. Where two or more candidates are ranked equally pursuant to the promotional procedure set forth herein, preference shall be given to the candidate who is first a resident over a nonresident pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-122.6 and then with the most seniority in service pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-129.

D. The Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law shall convene the reviewing committee for departmental promotions, which shall consist of the Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law, the Business Administrator and the Chief of Police (the "Reviewing Committee").

E. Promotion Testing Procedure. The promotion testing procedure for the River Vale Police Department shall consist of written examination (and for promotions to Lieutenant or Captain a written submission as well) and an oral examination (and for promotions to Lieutenant or Captain an oral interview as well) in which all candidates will be given the same questions and a review of the candidates' service record, education, merit and seniority.

(1) Written examination/Written Submission.

(a) The written examination shall be supplied by a professional testing company; professional law enforcement organization or such other written examination approved by the Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law. To proceed to the oral portion of the examination procedure, a candidate must achieve a minimum score of 70% on the written portion. At their request, candidates may review their own individual written test answers and scores in comparison to the master copy of questions and answers for the written portion of the exam. This review shall take place with the Chief of Police or his or her designee.

(b) For all positions above the rank of sergeant, each candidate shall provide three copies of a written submission about themselves to the Business Administrator of the Township of River Vale. Such submission shall include, but not be limited to, the candidate's resume (training, education, experience, hobbies, awards, etc.) and a statement as to why such candidate should be promoted to the position sought.

(2) Oral examination(s)/Oral Interview.

(a) Candidates shall be notified, in writing, of their successful or unsuccessful completion of the written portion of the exam by the Chief of Police or his or her designee.

(b) Candidates that successfully achieve a score of 70% on the written examination shall be permitted to sit for an oral examination by the Reviewing Committee. The oral examination shall take place after the receipt of the written examination scores.

(c) Candidates must score at least 70 out of 100 in the oral examination to proceed to the next step in the promotional process. At their request, candidates may review their own individual oral examination answers and scores

in comparison to the master copy of questions and answers for the oral examination. This review shall take place with the Chief of Police or his or her designee.

(d) For all positions above the rank of sergeant the next step in the process will be an interview with the Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law, the Business Administrator and the Chief of Police. Candidates for positions below the rank of lieutenant will proceed from the oral exam directly to the review of service record.

(e) The interview with the Mayor or his/her designee as provided by law, the Business Administrator and the Chief of Police shall focus on leadership and management skills, knowledge of River Vale's form of government, knowledge of the Police Department Ordinance, familiarity with municipal budget process and knowledge of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-118. The Mayor, Business Administrator and Chief of Police shall grade each candidate on a one-hundred-point scale.

(3) Record review.

(a) Candidates that successfully achieve a score of 70% on the written examination or written submission and 70% on the oral examination shall proceed to the next step in the promotional process, the review of service record.

(b) The Reviewing Committee shall examine the length and merit of candidate's service. The examination process shall give specific weight to performance evaluations, seniority, military service, demonstrated leadership ability, education and disciplinary history.

(4) Scoring Procedure. The weight or percentage of each portion of the process shall be as follows:

(a) Sergeant.

- 1o Written test 30%
- 2o Oral exam 30%
- 3o Performance evaluations 20%
- 4o Leadership evaluation 10%
- 5o Seniority 5%
- 6o Education 5%
- 7 o Associates degree = 2.5%
- 8 o Bachelors degree = 3.5%
- 9 o Masters degree or higher = 5.0%
- 1 o Two years of active-duty military experience can be substituted for associates degree if honorably discharged.
- 2 o Associate's degree and two years of active-duty military experience will be worth 3.5% if honorably discharged.
- 3o Police discipline shall be a minus, if within six months of the review of the service record, the discipline has been officially adjudicated and permanently placed in the candidate's personnel file. A more than five day suspension shall extend the review of the service record up to one year.
- 4 o Written reprimand = -1.0%
- 5 o 1-2 days suspension = -2.5%
- 6 o 3-5 days suspension = -5.0%
- 7 o More than 5 day suspension = -10.0%

(b) Lieutenant and Captain.

- 1o Written test 15%
- 2o Written submission 15%
- 3o Oral exam 15%
- 4o Interview with the Mayor, Chief of Police and Business Administrator 15%
- 5o Performance evaluations 20%
- 6o Leadership evaluation 10%
- 7o Seniority 5%
- 10o Education 5%

- 11 o Associates degree = 2.5%
- 12 o Bachelors degree = 3.5%
- 13 o Masters degree or higher = 5.0%
- 8 o Two years of active-duty military experience can be substituted for associates degree if honorably discharged.
- 9 o Associate's degree and two years of active-duty military experience will be worth 3.5% if honorably discharged.
- 10o Police discipline shall be a minus, if within six months of the review of the service record, the discipline has been officially adjudicated and permanently placed in the candidate's personnel file. A more than five day suspension shall extend the review of the service record up to one year.
- 11 o Written reprimand = -1.0%
- 12 o 1-2 days suspension = -2.5%
- 13 o 3-5 days suspension = -5.0%
- 14 o More than 5 day suspension = -10.0%

F. The review committee shall rank each candidate based on the total score as outlined above. The candidates shall then be ranked from the highest to lowest based on score. The list shall include the candidates' names and the final scores.

G. The review committee shall then submit the results of the process listing the breakdowns and final scores of the candidates and any other information that may be pertinent to the Mayor for final decision.

H. Candidates who achieve an overall score of 70% or greater shall be placed on a one-year promotional list.

I. Eligibility for Testing. All candidates for promotion must have served three years with Township of River Vale as a full-time patrol officer by the date of written test in order to be eligible to participate in the promotional process. Promotions to the rank of sergeant shall be open to patrol officers. When a vacant sergeant position exists or is anticipated and there is a desire by the Township of River Vale to fill such position, a promotional process shall be administered and a separate list created and the sergeant list will consist of patrolmen who successfully complete the process.

J. Promotions to ranks above sergeant shall be open to members of the next lowest rank, unless the Mayor, in the best interest of the Department, chooses to test a wider pool of candidates, in which case he or she may open testing to the two next lowest ranks (a pool of less than three eligible candidates will not generally be considered "in the best interest of the Department"). An officer who tests for a higher rank and does not achieve the 70% score necessary to make the promotion list referred to in Section-H is ineligible to take an exam for that rank or a higher rank, for a period of one year from the date of the promotion list.

ROLL CALL VOTE

Councilman de Stefan, Councilman Matos, Councilwoman Sieg, Councilman Bromberg, and Council President Jasionowski voted yes.

HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

Motion by Councilman de Stefan; seconded by Councilman Matos to open the meeting to the public.

Ted Stemple – 558 Westwood Avenue – commented on the zoning ordinance regarding Cedar Lane. Mr. Stemple suggested that the professionals hired to work for the town be held to a higher standard.

Maura Ellis – 84 Le Clerc Avenue – thanked the Mayor and Council again for their support and work on the defeated High School budget.

There being no further questions or comments from the public; motion by Councilman Bromberg; seconded by Councilwoman Sieg to close the meeting to the public.

Motion by Councilman Bromberg; seconded by Councilman Matos to adjourn the meeting to Closed Session at 9:00 pm. Action will be taken.
